Charles Laygo Sr., a loving husband, father, and grandfather, passed away on Friday, December 18, 2020 at the age of 59. Charlie was born on October 2, 1961 in Manila, Philippines to Dr. Paul and Lois Laygo. In 1963 he came to the United States with his family. It wasn't until 1974 that Charlie moved to Fresno and laid down roots. He graduated from Fresno State with a Bachelor's degree in Business-Finance and while attending school he met his sweetheart, Laniebelle Martinez. They eventually wed on the day of Love, February 14, 1987 and had four children. As a young adolescent Charlie loved to skateboard with his brothers around local spots in Fresno. At one point they were locally sponsored skateboard competitors. Later in life his hobbies included being an automotive enthusiast. He was passionate about different vehicles and loved to try them out. He enjoyed visiting the coast and loved watching the sun rise and set whenever he could. Charlie was a hardworking dedicated man. He was a 20 Year Veteran of the Fresno County Probation Department who began his career in 1999. He worked as a Juvenile Correctional Officer and dedicated his life to working with at-risk youth. We remember him as an easygoing, funny, kind hearted man who will be greatly missed. One of his greatest wishes was that he wanted his children to experience as much as they could growing up. He will forever be in our hearts. Charlie was preceded in death by his parents Paul and Lois Laygo, his sister Estrella Parker, father-in-law Ernesto Martinez, and brother-in law Dan O'Brien. He is survived by his wife Laniebelle; his four children: Jonathan, Charles Jr., Amanda, and Brandon; and his two grandchildren Hayden and Conrad.

“ My memory of Charlie that I want to share is during the time that he was our dad’s caregiver. My parents had three girls followed by three boys. Charlie was the middle son, like our dad. They were close. Our dad had an easy relationship with Charlie. They both had big hearts and loved people. Their favorite thing was getting together around a table and eating and talking. A couple of years after our mom died, our dad was diagnosed with dementia. As we became more aware that our dad had severe health issues, Charlie and Lanie were thinking about how he was going to make it alone in his house. He was already in his late eighties and he didn’t want to move to a care home. Charlie expressed interest in helping him but it meant a lot of sacrifice because he still needed to work full-time to support his family. Charlie thought and struggled about the demands of being a caregiver. Eventually his big heart relented and he moved his family and household to our dad’s house. His other job was working at the Fresno County Probation Department with at-risk youth. He had a big heart too for those kids and co-workers and found comfort at work after being with our dad all day. As luck would have it, Charlie worked grave shift and Lanie days so someone was always home to take care of our dad. Charlie sacrificed the time he would normally have for his three sons and daughter and two grandchildren. The arrangement worked pretty well for almost three years until Covid spread deeply in the Central Valley. Charlie got Covid. While Charlie was fighting for his life in the ICU, our dad passed away at home. It was so sad they didn’t know what was happening and they weren’t able to say their thank yous and goodbyes to anyone. This sadness has become our life now. Our dad died on December 1 and Charlie on December 18. They will be forever linked. We are so grateful to Charlie and Lanie for taking care of our dad, making sure he went to his appointments, giving him his medication everyday, taking him to church, and keeping him healthy, clean, and fed. Our dad is grateful for their care, compassion, companionship, and love during his final years.
