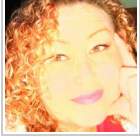

“ My first memories of my cousin Jackie began during the mid-eighties, I always thought of Cousin Jackie as my "Aunt Jackie" - because of the way we Mejia's are about who we are to one another. And so, Aunt Jackie and I first met by chance one evening in South Fresno near the City of Fowler during the mid eighties. My older brother and I were a couple of crazy kids. We spent much of our time working in the rural areas. There, we spent much of our time during the eighties, re-acquainting ourselves with the extended family, for the Mejia's have many relatives who are close, but tend to live far from one another.

Aunt Jackie welcomed both my older brother, Robert and I one evening while stopping briefly to introduce ourselves at her home, visiting the many cousins there, and umm... "hanging out with the younger cousins like Cousin Manual, David, Prax, Debbie, and Linda, and Patty" Ahh... "Those were the days of Bartles & James, Boone's Farm, Miller Genuine Draft, House Parties, Cruising, and great times for some of us with the family and close friends." Stopping to visit and talk with the cousins was a great opportunity to learn about our Uncle Manual, and the stories about days in Malaga, where the Mejia's had much to do in the affairs of auto dismantling, industrial fabrication, and product development. Yes, it was a very exciting time. We often would pass by places such as Pick-A-Part and feel a sense of pride, knowing Uncle Manual (Grandpa's Older Brother) once owned a wrecking yard nearby. And, as a kid who learned how to buy, repair, and later sell cars, owning a wrecking yard was in-fact - VERY COOL. Aunt Jackie used to tell us little stories now and then about our own and extended family because - 'she had such a great great memory and knew all the stories.' Amazing..`! How we kids so enjoyed; learning about some of the family's adventures and deeds when Aunt Jackie would stop what she was doing, and took a moment out of her busy life to educate us kids about what our grandparents and parents accomplished over so many decades. She knew all the stories since long before I was born. I could not but help but be impressed. She was smart, beautiful, and kind. We couldn't help but love and

admire Aunt Jackie. And as the decades passed, she became one of the Elder Mejia's; someone who held great wisdom and experience in the affairs of the Mejia Families living now for some time within Central California, known in many circles as "The Bread Basket of the World."

Jackie always had the most beautiful and loving smile when we drove up to her home. She always greeted us, asked us about her cousin Robert Mejia Sr., and made us feel so very welcome, and we knew there, - we had a special place to visit because we were all Mejia's and we share a common history, i.e., the stories and deeds about the history of the Mejia's near Malaga were that of legend for us kids, lol. Aunt Jackie would often help us remember who is who, who we are in relation to one another, and helped to ensure we remembered our family history.

Aunt Jackie was very knowledgeable and "learned us" as Grandpa Tony might say when we were little kids about "the history of the Mejia's who once came to dwell in the Southern communities near Fresno, California." Jackie was well known by my Grandpa, Antonio "Tony" Mejia, Father, Robert "Bob" Mejia, and Grandmother, Concepcion, "Concha" Mejia. "Everybody spoke highly of her all the time." She was well known throughout the family as being the daughter-in-law of Manual Mejia, my Great Uncle and of course, My Grandpa's Older Brother. ;)

We have so much respect and for our Aunt Jackie Mejia. She will live in our hearts forever with great love, respect, and admiration for having her being in our lives for so many decades.
