Hazel Mary McQuone passed away peacefully on February 9, 2019 in Fresno, Ca at 94 years old. She was born to Louis and Josephine Sarina on April 5, 1924 in Soledad, Ca. She attended Greenfield Elementary and King City High Schools. After graduation she worked at Eagle Field in Dos Palos. After the war she moved to Fresno and worked at Chandler Field.

She met and married the love of her life, Marvin McQuone on January 18, 1947. She and Marvin founded Commercial Electro Plating in 1956.

Hazel was active in Sacred Heart Catholic Church and School. She was a member of Beta Sigma Phi Sorority for more than 70 Years. She was a board member of Meadows Lakes Club. She was a lifetime member of Central Valley Aviation Association, due to her love of Aviation.

Hazel was an avid reader and in later years she enjoyed listening to books on tape. She was a knitter, and made many of her own clothes. She delighted in her classes in Brazilian Embroidery.

When she and Marvin retired they traveled the world, and after Marvin's death, she continued traveling with her sister Alyce or her brother Joe. She

She was preceded in death by her husband Marvin, her son David, her older brother Joe Sarina and younger sister Dorothy Sarina.

She is survived by her daughter, Elizabeth Ann Cassady. Also grand children Matthew McQuone, Colin Cassady, Dane McQuone, Katie Botello and Noah Bean and their spouses, and great-grandchildren Daniel, Addisen, Morgan and Charlie.
