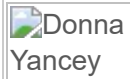

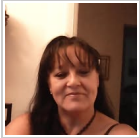

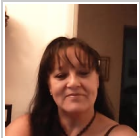

“ The first memories that I have of Larry are both funny and scary. He was just a few weeks old when he first came over to our house to meet his cousins. I have two boys and they were very excited to meet their new cousin. They were 2 and 4 and very curious about the new baby. Larry was laying on a big and I mean really big brown pillow (these pillows were very popular in the late 80's and early 90's) He was swaddled real good in his blanket, had another blanket over him and was laying on a nice big blanket right in the middle of the BIG brown pillow. The grownups were visiting in the living room for a little bit when we thought it was just to quiet for there to be 2 little boys and a baby in the house. We got up and looked at the pillow and Larry was not there, I imagine we must have panicked to some degree, then we looked down my long hallway and saw my two boys pulling Larry by the big blanket headed to their room to play.

The last memory I have of Larry is from earlier this month when he took his cousin to the grocery store because he was homeless and hungry. Larry told him he could get anything he wanted. My son said anything??? Really??? Larry said yeah, so his cousin proceeded to pick some enchilada's that were \$12. even though Larry and Jeannie didn't have "extra money" Larry just smiled and got him the enchilada's. That is the kind of person Larry was. He would bring my son food, and would pick him up and take him for a ride just to get him out of his trailer. This being the same cousin that pulled him down a long hallway over 30 years ago. Larry and Jeannie were the only people who came to visit my son in the 2 years he lived in the trailer behind his brothers house. (the other blanket pulling cousin and the master mind of the incident) They were regular visitors. No one else came, but Larry did, even in the winter. They would make a fire in a trash can and talk about the old days. Larry had the biggest heart of anyone I know. He was a smiling, happy, big bear hugging type of guy. He would give you the shirt off of his back, or his last dollar. He loved deep when he loved you, and he loved his cousin's. I will always be so grateful for the patience and love he

had for his cousin and the love and respect he had for my other son, his oldest cousin. My boys and I have a big empty spot in our heart for Larry. He will forever be missed. We will never get over that he went way to soon. R.I.P. Cuz

One of the very first memories I have of Larry is both funny and scary. He was just a few weeks old and his parents were visiting at our house. He was swaddled very tightly in his blanket (thank goodness) and there was a blanket under him. He was laying right in the middle of a huge and I mean huge pillow (they were very popular in the late 70's and early 80's.) I had 2 boys that were ages 2 and 4, they were so excited to have a new cousin and they couldn't get enough of him. We, the grown ups were visiting and talking about the new baby like every family does when we noticed it was awfully quiet in the house to have 2 toddlers and a baby. We looked at the pillow and Larry was gone, I'm sure we freaked out for a moment then we looked down the hall and my boys had pulled him off the pillow by the blanket he was laying on and dragged him down the hall so they could get to know him. That is how close they were then and that is how close they continued to be their whole life.

The last memory I have of Larry is not that long ago. He was with his cousin (my son) the very one that pulled him off that pillow so many years ago, He had come to visit him and brought him something to eat. Larry had such a big heart, when he loved you it was a deep love. He had that deep love for my son. Not many people could stand to be around my son for years now. Larry and Jennie were the only people who visited him in the last two years when he lived on his brothers property. Larry visited often and where Larry was Jeannie was, they would take him to the river or maybe just for a little ride to get him out of the house for a while. Even when Larry had hardly any money he would take his cousin to the store and let him pick ANY thing he wanted to eat. He would look at Larry then Jeannie and say 'Really are you sure", then usually picked something that cost \$12-\$15. But Larry would just smile and get it for him.

I will never forget Larry and his big Heart. I loved him when he was born, I have loved him through good and bad but I never expected him to go before I did. I guess I could just say I loved him all his life.
