“ Phillip Avila was my first cousin once removed. Spent my summers in Fresno growing up . My sister and I were close in age to Diane and Lillian, his sisters. patchwork of childhood memories that feel like home. I remember visiting his parents, Frank and Julia, in Highway City—the very place Phillip now resides.

One of my favorite memories involves a horse Frank had. Now, I won't say I was any good at riding it, but we sure tried. You can imagine the comedy of kids clambering onto a horse that had no patience for amateurs. Frank and my father were first cousins but acted more like brothers, which made our families intertwined in ways that went beyond just blood.

Phillip, though younger than he deserved to be at his passing, lived a life centered on family. That much was clear to anyone who knew him. He was a provider, a hard worker, and someone who found joy in the everyday moments with his loved ones. He could talk about his family endlessly—you'd hear about their achievements, their adventures, and the simple joy they brought to his life.

He wasn't just about words, though. Phillip put his work into action. I'll never forget when he laid the cement around my swimming pool. That pool became a place where friends gathered, laughed, and splashed around—and Phillip had a hand (literally) in creating that. People complimented the job for years, and every time they did, I smiled, thinking of him and his pride in a job well done.

Phillip also knew how to bring people together. He hosted an Avila Family Reunion that felt like a big, loud, loving celebration of everything that made our family unique. I'm grateful for that memory because it speaks to who Phillip was—a man who brought people together and made sure family stayed first.

His illness and all the hospital visits were hard on him—I know how much strength it took to face it all. But Phillip was as strong as they come, even when it was tiresome, and he kept his focus on what mattered most: his family.

To Cathy and the kids—you were Phillip's pride and joy, and I hope you know how much he loved you. He may be gone too soon, but his love, his hard work, and his dedication to family will live on. I can still hear his laugh, see his smile, and remember the warmth he
