PA TOPE OLU DARE ADEWUSI

A LIFE WELL LIVED

Temitope Oludare Adewusi, a dedicated father, beloved grandfather, devoted granduncle and loyal friend transitioned peacefully on July 6th, 2024, at 11:05 p.m. He was 86 years old.

Pa Adewusi was born June 14, 1938, in Ode-remo Sagamu, the second born of Mr. and Mrs. Ezekial Gbadewola Adewusi. Pa attended Igbobi and Saint Gregory's College in his early years. In 1960, he started his studies at UCLA and shortly thereafter transferred to UC Berkeley where he graduated with a bachelor's degree in electrical engineering. He later received his master's degree in electrical engineering from Colorado State University. In 1977, Pa moved back to Nigeria to start his family and begin his career at the University of Ife as the Director of the Electrical Engineering Department. Even with his numerous accomplishments, becoming a father was the greatest achievement of his life, bringing him immense pride and joy

In 1983, he moved back to the United States and began his career at Bechtel in San Louis Obispo and then in 1985 moved to Fresno to begin his new career at PG&E. Pa was a jack of all trades, while he began his professional career as an engineer, he was also a teacher and then retired as a union

organizer in 2009, a job he truly treasured.

As a young child, Pa was raised in an Episcopalian home but as he got older his spiritual journey led him to discover Theravada Buddhism. He fell in love with the religion and became a practicing Buddhist for over 50 years, spending hours a day meditating and reading to deepen his connection to the religion. He also had a strong passion for his traditional Yoruba culture and religion and was committed to mentoring others and preserving its cultural traditions. In addition, he loved to spend time gardening and could often be found in his backyard tending to his many fruits and vegetables. Pa loved to cook delicious meals using his home grown produce and shared his harvest with those close to him.

Pa Adewusi loved spending time with his family. He had always looked forward to becoming a grandfather, which he did in 2019 with the birth of Jaiye Djifa Tope de Souza. His later years were often spent with his grandson by his side, sharing stories and family memories. He was known for his generosity and compassion, always willing to lend a helping hand or listening ear. A resident of Fresno for over 40 years, Dad was a staple member of the community. He was a founding father of the Nigerian Association of the Central Valley and served on the City of Fresno's MLK committee for over a decade. His lifelong commitment to community engagement and spreading Nigerian culture will be his enduring legacy.

Leaving to cherish his memories are his daughter Bose, grandson Jaiye de Souza, his sisters Mrs. Yemisi Adedeji, Mrs. Titilayo Macaulay, his brother Ayodele Adewusi, his niece Olufunmilayo Odunlami, grandniece Yetunde Ajayi and her children Ayomide and Dayo Akintola, and all his extended family in Nigeria and around the world.

“ After the passing of Mr. Adewusi, I began to reflect more on our relationship and how he impacted my life during the 16 years that I knew him. To me he was many things. An elder, friend, mentor, teacher, father figure, priest, leader, an overall genuine presence and example in my life, someone who was worth emulating. Prior to attending his funeral, I was grateful to him for many things. However, after listening to the testimonies of those who spoke in honor of him during his funeral and learning about the impact he made on the lives of others, my gratitude for him took on an even deeper meaning. Not only was I more grateful for him, but I also became very proud of him.

Upon returning home from his funeral I felt inspired to learn more about the path that he walked in life that allowed him to become the man that he was. Although my relationship with Mr. Adewusi as a student was primarily centered around my studies and practice of the native religion of his culture, the Ifa tradition, upon returning home from his funeral, I felt the impulse to explore more of the spiritual path he walked outside of Ifa. Knowing of Mr. Adewusi's affinity for the teachings of the Buddha, I felt inspired to attend a local Buddhist meeting in honor of him. During my time there I felt a strong connection with him, and a deep state of peace awakened in me, a feeling of being connected with my authentic self. I realized that in those moments of peace, in those moment of authenticity and connection with my innermost essence, Mr. Adewusi's presence could be felt there. I realize that although he has passed, he will always be there.

As a priest in the tradition of Ifa, I help lead a spiritual community dedicated to the Yoruba Religion. In our weekly Ifa community meeting following Mr. Adewusi's funeral, I chose to dedicate it to talking about how Mr. Adewusi contributed to my personal journey in Ifa. Mr. Adewusi was my first and most influential teacher in the Ifa tradition. Most of what I teach and how I teach it was inspired by him. Therefore, I wanted my students to learn more about Mr. Adewusi's life and how he influenced my journey in the Yoruba

Religion. During the meeting, I displayed his photo, talked about his life, his perspective upon the Ifa tradition, about some of the experiences I had with him over the years, the impact he's made in my life, and how he contributed to my journey in Ifa. After that I centered the discussion around death and how it is a major teacher in life, using the life of Mr. Adewusi as encouragement to discover our greatness in life, to dare to become all that we truly can in this life, to make a meaningful impact on the lives of others as he did, to make the most of our time on earth. During this meeting, I could once again feel the presence of Mr. Adewusi. The moment I shared his photo and mentioned his name, the hair on the back of my neck began to stand up and I felt a descent of grace pour into my being from above and I became enveloped in a vast field of energy. I could feel how this energy uplifted me and then became transmitted to all the students who were present. Once again, I realized that although Mr. Adewusi has passed, he will always be there in and through those special moments of grace.

Learning about the impact that Mr. Adewusi was able to make on the lives of so many people, I would feel fortunate if I was able to influence the life of even one human being in such a way throughout my lifetime. I will be forever grateful for Mr. Adewusi and intend to carry on his legacy, to pass on what he has taught me both in knowledge and through his humanity.
